

Packing List - Important to pack each item and you are ready to go!

- Passport**
- Sleeping pad, (backpacking type), warm sleeping bag, and small pillow.** On your High Adventure Sailing Trip you will be sleeping on deck to enjoy the stars. If it rains, there is room to sleep down below inside the ship. Make sure your sleeping gear will keep you warm!
- Water Bottle and carabineer** - You will clip this to the lifeline. See picture
- Towel** - if possible those small quick dry towels are wonderful.
- 1 or 2 swimming suits** - Make sure your swimming suit will not chafe you. We suggest you cut out that scratchy netting and wear underwear/under armour underneath your suit.
- Wide brimmed hat** - It is helpful if it ties around your chin so it stays on while sailing.
- Sunglasses** - It is helpful with a strap around your head so they won't fall off.
- Suntan lotion** - The sun is intense so bring something with high protection. **Do not bring SPRAY suntan lotion** - you will not be allowed to use it on the boat.
- Underwear**
- Several T-shirts**
- 2-3 pairs of shorts**
- 1 lightweight long pants**
- 1 long sleeve shirt for sun protection**
- 1-2 pairs of socks**
- Beach walking/Hiking shoes that can get wet**
- Toiletry Items** - toothbrush, toothpaste, comb, lotion, shaving gear etc.
- Small flashlight or "head" light**
- Light rain gear**
- Medication needed for the week**
- Light jacket or sweatshirt** - this is for warmth. It is nice if it has a hood to keep you warm in the wind. Don't really need this during the summer months.
- Good book to read**
- First Aid Kit** - One kit that covers the needs of your group
- Adults** - if you like to drink coffee please bring a non- breakable mug with carabineer so you can hang it on the lifeline of the ship
- One Roll of Duct Tape for the whole Troop** (one roll per troop)



- Do you have a **mustache or beard?** Getting your snorkel mask to seal over the facial hair under your nose is difficult. So you have a couple options. Shave it off! Yes, this is your best solution. Don't worry it will grow back. If you just can't bear to shave it off please bring a **small container of Vaseline**. You can spread the Vaseline over your facial hair under your nose and it will help seal your snorkel mask.
- A little extra spending money** - One evening you will eat out as a group at a local restaurant called Captain Jack's in Hope Town. With a drink and tip it will probably cost between \$20 - \$25. Talk with your adult leaders as to other expenses to consider.

Optional Items:

- Camera** - waterproof is helpful
- Your own snorkel gear** - We have top of the line snorkel gear on board for you. So unless you have your own gear that you prefer don't bring any snorkel gear. Definitely don't go buy cheap gear to bring for this charter. It will leak and you will end up using ours anyway. We are ready for you to enjoy some awesome snorkeling!
- Hammock to sleep in** - We do have room to hang 8 hammocks on deck.
 If you bring a hammock you **MUST** get it ready to be use on our ship. You will be tying it from our rigging (not in a tree like you normally do). So you **MUST** do this:
 1. Remove all metal pieces and carabineers!! No metal clips on your hammock!!
 2. Remove the strap ties on the ends. Straps ties won't work to tie to the rigging!
 3. Tie 6 ft. of 3/8" non-stretch line to each end of your hammock.
 4. Do NOT bring your hammock unless you have completed the 3 steps above!

Policies while on board:

- iPod/Music device** - You will not be allowed to listen to electronic music while on board. We have a couple guitars, bongos, and harmonicas. If you have an instrument you'd like to bring you are welcome to bring it. We will make our own music on board!
- Phones** - time to "unplug" while on board Ciganka! The "youth" will give their phones to an adult leader prior to boarding and not used during the duration of this trip. We understand the adults have their phone as a contact source during the trip. But PLEASE adults, set a good example for the youth in not using them unless absolutely needed. This is your time to unplug also!

We do have outlets throughout the boat to plug in your cameras and phones to recharge them.
